Methodological framework for Career ROCKET Festival Framework

Project: „Career ROCKET: Respect, Opportunities, Choice, Knowledge, Equality and Training”

Objective: Preparation for Career Rocket festivals in pilot schools

Short description. Accordingly, with the project description, The Career ROCKET festival is a core activity in **WS3**. It will be a two-day festival with “Boys’ Day” when male professionals in predominantly perceived as female occupations meet with students and introduce their professions and “Girls’ Day” when female professionals in predominantly perceived as male occupations meet with students and introduce their profession. There will also be speed dating for girls with female professionals in technology and engineering. Parents with occupations perceived as untraditional for their gender will also be invited to talk with the students. Female technology and engineering professionals will be recruited with the support eventually of DNA associations in partner countries. All adults that will participate in the event will be instructed to abide the rights of the children and child protection policies of partner organizations. Career ROCKET festival activities will be presented to parents during parents’ meetings together with information materials on gender equality and career choices for parents.

The Career Festival is an event organized in each partner school within the project. It is an event developed with the support and involvement of students and teachers participating in the training courses organized through the Career ROCKET project.

The festival can be associated with any relevant event for school and / or community (eg School Day, Community Day). A participant can take part in one or more events organized during the 2 days (students and teachers, community members, graduates of the school with significant careers in various fields, parents, guests from other schools).

On the occasion of the activities organized during the Festival students, girls and boys will have the opportunity to meet with professionals from different fields of activity (eg women with a career in a technical field).
